DRD 11	Disability and Identity	1555	In Person Petaluma Campus	Students will analyze representations of disability in popular culture and identify the impacts of perceptions and identity of people with disabilities. This course will explore the evolution of disability culture in the United States. This course is intended for all students, with or without disabilities, and will focus on inclusion and equity.
DRD 313	Strat For Mental Health	0896	Online	This course is designed to promote the academic success of students with mental health conditions. Students will gain a basic understanding of common factors that contribute to mental health conditions, as well as strategies to improve emotional regulation, stress management, and self-advocacy.
DRD 363	Intro Career Development	0712	Partially Online	In this course, students will address career planning and job search techniques, with an emphasis on career interests and values, labor market trends, job seeking and interview skills, and disability management in the workplace.

DRD 638.1	College Success: 1	0214	In Person	This course provides opportunities for students to explore and practice organization, time management, and note-taking skills. It also includes topics specific to the use of disability related services and campus resources

Students will be supported in attending campus, community, and career education opportunities and activities



DRD 370E	<i>Trans to Employment 1</i>	2745	In Person	Students with disabilities will develop a plan for on-the-job support and disability management in the workplace. Students will initiate the planning of a campus and/or community event or activity.
DRD 390.2	<i>Communication Skills</i>	0369	In Person	This course will provide students with an overview of the communicative process and strategies for effective communication in daily life, especially focusing on school and workplace environments, as they relate to individuals with disabilities. Students will identify and apply strategies that address the functional limitations of their disability
DRD 391	<i>Coll Resources & Strats</i>	2741	In Person	Students will learn about college resources, community resources, and strategies that contribute to the academic success of students with disabilities. This course also addresses how students can safely and effectively navigate the college campus and resources.
DRD 700	<i>Learning Strategies</i>	1588	In Person	Through this course, students will receive specialized instruction and/or support to maximize their college success. <i>This section is for concussion education/baseline testing for intercollegiate and club sports.</i>
DRD 700	<i>Learning Strategies</i>	0739	In Person	Through this course, students will receive specialized instruction and/or support to maximize their college success. <i>This section is for Deaf students and will be taught in ASL.</i>
DRD 700	<i>Learning Strategies</i>	1565	Online	<i>This section is for college success strategies for Rising Scholars students. This course will require scheduled meetings with the instructor. Student and instructor will determine mutually agreed upon day/time.</i>
DRD 705	<i>Hearing Loss Strategies</i>	0721	Online	This course provides education and support for adults with hearing loss. Students will learn about hearing technology (cochlear implants and hearing aids), community resources, and overcoming communication challenges



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DRD 761	<i>Job Search Strategies</i>	4534	Online	In this course, students will determine employment readiness and explore application of job search strategies. <i>This section is restricted for College to Career students.</i>
DRD 784	<i>Assistive Technology Lab</i>	1660	In Person	In this course, students will explore access technology in a lab or classroom setting. Students may work independently, participate in group and/or individual instruction, structured workshops, and other academic support activities after meeting with an Access Technology Specialist. <i>The Assistive Technology Center is providing services via Zoom, phone and in-person. The operational hours are MTWTh 8:00am-4:00pm and F 8:00am-12:00pm. Students will meet with an Assistive Technology Specialist for an intake appointment prior to enrolling in this course.</i>
