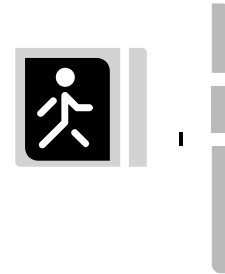


Guidelines for Sharing Information About Deaf Students with Other Interpreters, Specialists and Supervisors

Green Light:

This information is freely shared...

- Student does not show up for class.
- Scheduling concerns/conflicts.
- Student is late to class.
- Student's signing preferences, i.e. ASL, SEE, CDI.
- Specialized vocabulary for this class.
- Teacher's preferences re: location of the interpreter, lighting, etc...
- Need for captioned films in class.
- Arrangements for field trips.
- Change in number of interpreters needed.

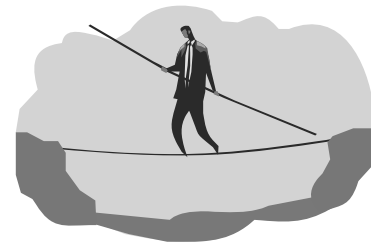


Yellow Light:

Proceed with caution!

Shared on a Need to Know Basis...

- Conflicts between two students, student and instructor, or student and interpreter.
- The reason a student does not show up for class. It is the student's choice whether or not they share this information, and the interpreter should consider the "need to know" before sharing this information.
- Student may benefit from tutoring or testing accommodations (extra time or test interpreted). The interpreter can refer student to a DRD Specialist.



Red Light:

Do not share this information without the student's permission...

- Comments the teacher makes to the interpreter. Interpreter should direct the teacher to the student or specialist. It is ok to talk to the teacher about accommodation issues- see green area above.
- Gossip or information about a student's personal life or relationships.
- Whether or not a student is paying attention in class or sleeping in class.
- Whether or not the student is participating in class discussions.
- Student's progress in class or scores on tests.
