The California Dream Act Application allows students interested in attending eligible California colleges, Universities and Career Education Programs to apply for state financial aid. This application is unrelated to the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program.

[Doyle scholarships](#)

With the implementation of AB19, all first-time, full-time students, regardless of income, may be eligible for a fee waiver or tuition reimbursement. Coupled with the prestigious Doyle Scholarship, all of our area's new high school graduates who choose to attend SRJC full-time in the fall following their high school graduation can **DOUBLE THE DOLLARS** they receive to attend school in their first year.
