Disability Resources Department (DRD) Support

Support is provided to increase access to curriculum

- Accommodations in class
- Support services outside of class
- Specialized instruction



Accommodations



- ✓ May be different from those you received in high school.
- ✓ Are authorized to provide equal access for students with disabilities.

Curriculum cannot be modified at the college level.

Some examples:

- Extra time for tests
- Note-taking and/or recording of Alternate Media (Audio text)

Support Services outside of class

Examples:

- Disability Management Advising
- Priority Registration
- Basic Computer Skills Instruction
- Assistive Technology/Alternate Media
- Equipment Loans
- Academic Counseling





Specialized Instruction

DRD offers classes that help students learn about disability management, study strategies and technology, including:

- College Success
- Adapted Physical Education (APE)
- Career Development
- Stress Management



How to Request DRD Services

- Submit Fall '24 SRJC application as a high school graduate (via SRJC website)
- Submit Request for Services and verification of disability (via DRD website)
- Meet with DRD Specialist for Welcome Meeting



Your DRD Welcome Meeting

- Have questions ready
- Look ahead at online schedule of classes
- Discuss your college goals with those who know you well
- Share these goals at your WELCOME MEETING
- Be ready to describe your experience in high school
- Students can invite anyone to attend the Welcome Meeting

UPDATE skills for personal enrichment or job growth


TRANSFER to a four year university to earn a Bachelor's Degree



Priority Registration Requirements

NEW STUDENT STEPS:

- Submit an application to SRJC
- Complete an online orientation
- Develop an education plan
- Register for Fall 2024 classes (late spring)





Math and English classes

- Students receive a math and English placement based on information provided on SRJC application
- A DRD specialist or counselor can help with deciding which math or English class to take

Education Plan:

A semester-by-semester map of the courses you need to reach your goal

An initial plan can be developed in **one** of the following ways:

Sign up for an Ed Plan workshop after completing online orientation *or*

Meet with a counselor (DRD has our own academic counselor) *or*

Create an abbreviated plan with DRD specialist in your Welcome Meeting

Once your initial education plan is developed, it can be updated and changed based on your personal, academic, and vocational goals.

In Class 30 hours per week

Study 24-30 hours per week

1 unit = 1 hour in class per week

For every hour in class, you can expect at least 2-3 hours of homework outside of class

College Fees



- Enrollment fees are \$46 per unit
- (12 units x \$46 = \$552)
- Health Services Fee = \$21
- Student Representation = \$2
- Transportation Fee = \$6
- Parking Permit = \$60 per semester
- Books and supplies varies by subject

Fees are due prior to enrolling for the **next** semester
